

What is a School - Parent Compact?

The School-Parent Compact is an agreement that parents, students, school staff and teachers develop together. It explains how parents, students, and teachers will work together to make sure all our students reach grade-level standards.

Preparing students for graduation

At New Manchester High School

Teachers will...

- Collaborate weekly with common course team to develop lesson plans that include rigor and remediation.
- Provide parents with resources to help their child at home with grade level/content skills.

Parents will:

- Access the school website and teacher webpages to get up to date class information.
- Participate in school activities such as attending parent/teacher conferences, grade level parent information nights, and annual advisement/registration conferences.

Students will:

- Complete credits to meet graduation requirements.
- Utilize teacher tutorials and online resources to support content mastery.
- Let my parents and teachers know when I do not understand.

Preparing Students for College and Career

At New Manchester High School

Teachers will...

- Serve as advisors to students to monitor their progress towards graduation from 9th-12th grades.
- Facilitate annual advisement conferences with parents to inform them of their child's progress towards graduation

- Partner with school counselors to access their child's individual skills and preparation for college and career readiness.
- Participate in school activities such as attending parent/teacher conferences, grade level parent information nights, and annual advisement/registration conferences.

- Develop relationships with their counselor and advisor to receive information and resources to prepare for college and career
